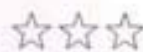

## **GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS**

- Guidelines are formulated keeping in view the utmost welfare of the students and the smooth functioning of the school. Therefore please read the contents of this Almanac carefully and also advise your ward about the rules laid down by the School authorities.
- Kindly address all your queries and communications to the Principal/Vice Principal/Headmistress through the class teacher and always mention clearly the name, admission number and class/section of your ward.
- You are required to inform the school about the change in your address or telephone number in writing. Ignorance of this will not be accepted as an excuse.
- Parents are requested not to enter classrooms to see their children or teacher during class hours.
- On being called by the school authority the Parents/Guardian should make it a point to visit the school and meet the relevant person.
- Distribution of any sort of gift item or presenting gift to any staff, student or any other member of school is prohibited even on special occasions.
- Kindly ensure that your ward does not carry any electronic gadget such as mobile phone, camera, iPad, Laptop, Pen-drive etc. to the school. Possession of such items by the students in the school will be treated as offence and the item will be confiscated and a fine of Rs. 500/- will be charged. Repeated offence will lead to firm action by school authorities.
- Students are expected to join school on the notified date at the beginning of the session and after vacations.
- You are requested to co-operate with the school in its attempt to help your ward's progress by paying attention to his regularity, punctuality and discipline.
- In case of any complaint or if your ward is not showing the desired progress, you should meet the Principal/Vice-Principal/Headmistress at the earliest or write to her personally well in time.
- Non-bus commuters should arrive at school 5 minutes before the stipulated schedule.
- Parent's attention is drawn to the facts that criticism of the teachers and of school in presence of a child should be compulsorily avoided because it causes the

students to lose respect for their teachers.

- Sick students should not be sent to school. Short leave is not permissible as it hampers our school proceedings.
- Participation in educational tours, Camps, Excursions, Seminars and all kinds of extra curricular activities organized by the school bring about an overall development in the personality of the child. Parents are requested to encourage such participation.
- They should desist from undesirable behaviour like whistling, shouting or running in corridors while in school. Insubordination, use of violence in any form, rowdyism, truancy, lying, cheating, stealing, arguments on caste and religion or insulting others.
- They should never cheat or be unfair at play or in paper and pen test, repetition of same may result in expulsion.
- Students when sick should not be sent to school.

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## **===== RULES FOR STUDENTS =====**

- Students should be habitually clean and neatly dressed. The school uniform is to be worn on all school days and on the PTM also.
- Students who are not properly dressed and whose general appearance does not conform to such regulations as the school prescribes may be sent back home.
- It is necessary that students obey the monitor appointed by the class teacher to maintain discipline during his/her absence from the class.
- It is compulsory for all children to converse in English as the CBSE syllabus stresses on student competence to speak confidently and fluently in English. A student must speak in decent language all the time. He must ensure that his speech is courteous and polite. No student should participate in any kind of rumour spreading and should refrain from speaking ill about others.
- Buying eatables from street vendors is strictly forbidden outside the school premises.
- Any communication sent from the school should be conveyed to the parents promptly. Parents must meet the teacher by prior appointments and with the



permission of the Principal/Vice-Principal/Headmistress only.

- The general behaviour of students should be good not only in the school but also outside. Any reported objectionable conduct outside the school will make the students liable for disciplinary action.
- Before leaving the class room at the end of the day student should arrange the desk and chairs in proper order. Switch off the lights and fans. Close the window. Throw the waste paper and unwanted materials in the dustbin and then leave the classroom.
- Children suffering from any infectious disease will not be allowed to attend the school until /He/she is free from the infection.
- Do not send expensive gifts and sweets on birthdays or any other festivals.
- Students are not allowed to wear any kind of ornaments in school. Except small earrings for girls.
- A students must extend due courtesy and respect to all members of staff. Respect for elders and affection for juniors should be soundly inculcated. Refinement in behaviour should distinguish every student of the school. Every child is expected to uphold the name and honour of the school.
- Students should arrive 5 minutes before the start of school and on the bell for assembly should go to the ground in a proper line.
- Students should take care of their belongings like books, money, clothes, etc. and anything left by the students in the school should be deposited in the school office as lost property.
- School property like furniture, walls, etc. should not be damaged or defaced.
- Be environment friendly. Throw waste papers, fruit peels wrappers, etc. in waste bins. Refrain from loitering and keep school premises and classrooms clean.
- The school reserves the right to expel any student whose academic progress is considered unsatisfactory or conduct is detrimental to the image of the school.
- Students are advised to bring their tiffin and water bottle with them when coming to school.
- Student are expected to organize themselves with a sense of 'self-control', self-discipline and 'self-direction.'



## == ABOUT THE SCHOOL ==

### • Houses

The school is divided into four houses i.e. Cosmos, Lily, Rose and Tulip. This division provides opportunities for a better organizational set-up and for a healthy competition in sports, academics and other activities among students. Every house has its house uniform which is worn on every Saturday and also whenever required.

### • Monitorial System

The system is an important feature of the school. Students showing administrative and leadership qualities are chosen as monitors. This is an honour and at the same time a means of stimulating an attitude of responsibility and initiative. It also serves as a channel

of communication between the staff and the students.

### • Discipline

Discipline and good conduct are the basic requirements of good citizenship. We teach our students to maintain the decorum of the institution. Any breach of rules, or use of abusive language or indecent behaviour that is likely to give a bad name to the school will invite disciplinary action leading to expulsion from the school. Children will be issued

yellow card as first warning, green card as second warning and red card as final warning

which will lead to suspension /expulsion. On the advice of disciplinary committee, the Principal may suspend or expel the student.

### • Identity Cards

Identity cards are issued to all pupils. Every identity card is valid for one session only. Every pupil has to carry her/his Identity Card with her/him in the school everyday.

## **Procedure For Withdrawal**

Three months advance notice in writing or three months fee in lieu of such a notice is needed for withdrawal of a student from the SCHOOL.

School leaving certificate will be issued on payment of ₹ 200/- A fine of ₹ 250/- will be charged for a duplicate.

Character certificate and Date of Birth certificate will be issued on payment of ₹ 100/- each. A Duplicate result will be issued only on payment of ₹ 300/-

Parents are required to apply at least a week in advance for Transfer Certificate or any other document.

### **Termination**

This may be effective on any one of the following grounds and the decision of the School will be final and binding on the parent concerned.

- Continuous long absence without prior sanctioned leave.
- Behavioural traits of the student detrimental to the school/class.
- Non-payment of fee or a chronic irregularity in payment as per schedule.
- Persistent negligence of School programmes by the Students/Parents.
- Disrespect by parents/guardians to the teaching and non-teaching staff.

**Note :** Minimum 75% attendance is compulsory for all students to appear in the final evaluation/examination held at the end of the academic year. Cases of shortage of attendance will be considered as per CBSE rules.

### **Transportation**

Transport facility may be available through private transporters. Transport users will be given information about stops and timings. School will not be responsible for any mishap/accident. However, we will not shy away from extending necessary help if required on humanitarian grounds, or in case of emergency. Parents wishing to opt transport facility are advised to contact transporter(s) personally.

### ( i ) Periodic Test (10 Marks) :

The school should conduct three periodic written tests in the entire academic year and the average of the best two will be taken. The schools have the autonomy to make its own schedule. However, for the purpose of gradient learning, three tests may be held as one being the mid-term test and other two being pre mid and post mid term with portion of syllabus cumulatively covered. The gradually increasing portion of contents would prepare students acquire confidence for appearing in the Board examination with 100% syllabus. The school take the average of the best two tests for final marks submission.

### ( ii ) Notebook submission (5 Marks) :

Notebook submission as a part of internal assessment is aimed at enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing notes for the topics being taught in the classroom as well as assignments. This also addresses the critical aspects of regularity, punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep.

### ( iii ) Subject Enrichment Activities (5 Marks) :

These are subject specific application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development. These activities to be recorded internally by respective subject teachers.



**For Languages :** Activities conducted for the subject enrichment in languages should aim at equipping the learner to develop effective speaking and listening skills.

**For Mathematics :** The listed laboratory activities and projects as given in the prescribed publication of CBSE / NCERT may be followed.

**For Science :** The listed practical works / activities may be carried out as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

**For Social Science :** Map and project work may be undertaken as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

## **2. Co-Scholastic Activities :**

School should promote co-curricular activities for the holistic development of the students. These activities will be graded on a 5-point grading scale (A to E) and will have no descriptive indicators. No up scaling of grades will be done.

## **3. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Values ) :**

Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps build character, Sincerity, good behavior and values develop strength foster unity and co-operation. Therefore the element of discipline has been introduced. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students on a five point scale (A to E).

The internal assessment comprising 20 marks (10+5+5) entails objectivity and a structured approach. for a holistic assessment, the teachers are expected to make it an effective tool.

### **Assessment Scheme for class I to IX in the CBSE affiliated schools :**

The CBSE affiliated schools, for the purpose of uniformity in classes I to IX may, replicate the same assessment model as described above for Class-X for Academic Year 2017-18.
